money of England $Item_I$ give and bequeath unto my Grandson Edward Lovelock Son of my said Son Edward five pounds of five lawfull money of England to be paid unto him so soon as he shall attaine to the age of one and twenty years And all the rest of my Estate goods and chattles I do give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Jane Lovelock whom I make sole and whole Executrix provided allwayes that if it shall happen my said Executrix shall marry my will is and do by these presents give and bequeath unto my said Son Edward Lovelock five hundred pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid unto him by my said Executrix over and above the said five pounds afore mentioned In Witness whereof I have hereunto sett my Hand and Sealthis two and twentiethday of November in the fourth year of the reign of our Sovereigns Lord and Lady King William and Queen Mary over England ...
